**A New Entry for the Museum**

Our Long Range Plan includes reorienting the main entrance from the Sewell House on St Mary's Square to the TeeTotem Building on E. Chestnut St. This project has for a long time been our next highest priority after completing the Chaney House Project. The new entrance would accomplish two major goals. First, a gradual ramp from the sidewalk to a rebuilt porch at the current double doors leading into the TeeTotem Building would provide an ADA compliant entrance. Secondly, this new configuration would place the docent desk with phone and our small souvenir table together and would allow us to visually return the Sewell House entirely to its 1860s period. In 2008, a design was commissioned and bids requested for estimated costs for a gradually sloped, landscaped brick path and new entry porch. Current preliminary estimates for the project are \$12,000. Visit the museum or the Community Supper to see a proposed layout of this project.

Recently, Christmas in St Michaels has pledged \$4000 to this project from their 2010 event. We plan to approach local funding sources this year. Our effort will be more successful if we can point to significant contributions from our members. Please include a donation with your new membership using the form below.
